FIG. 6 is a right side view of the smock.

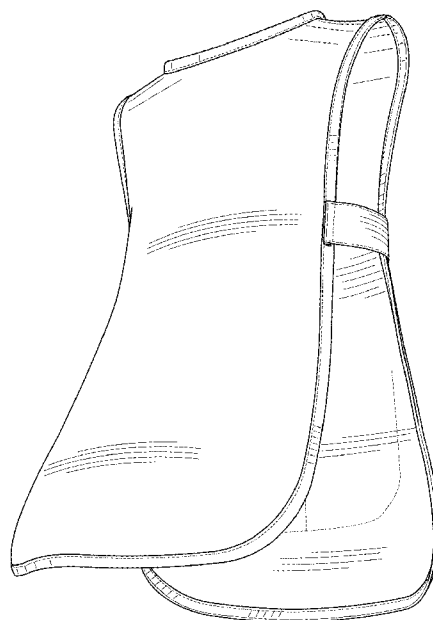
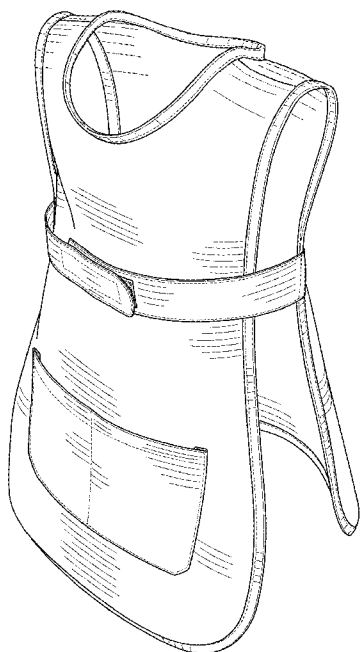
FIG. 7 is a back elevational view of the smock.

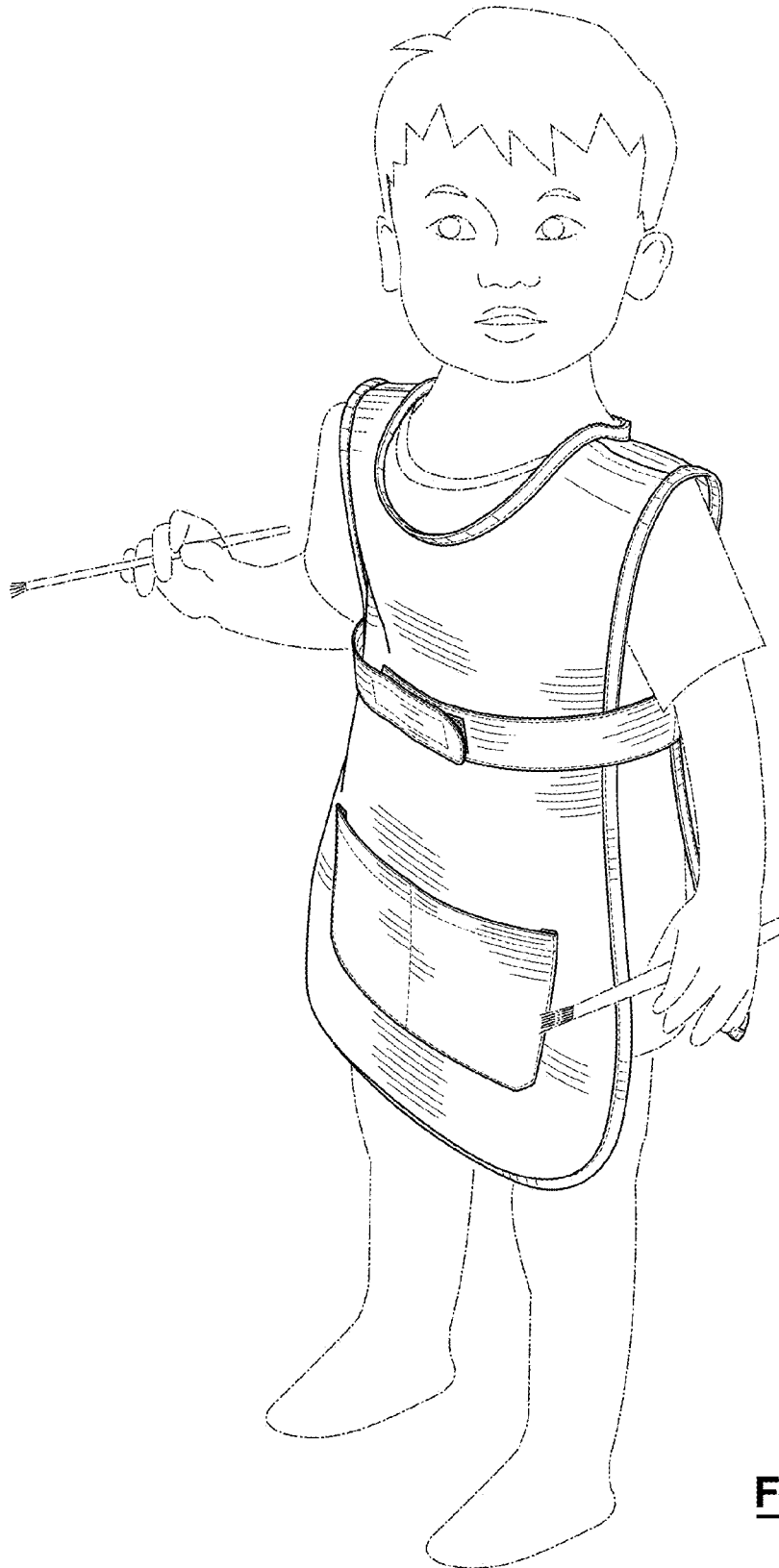

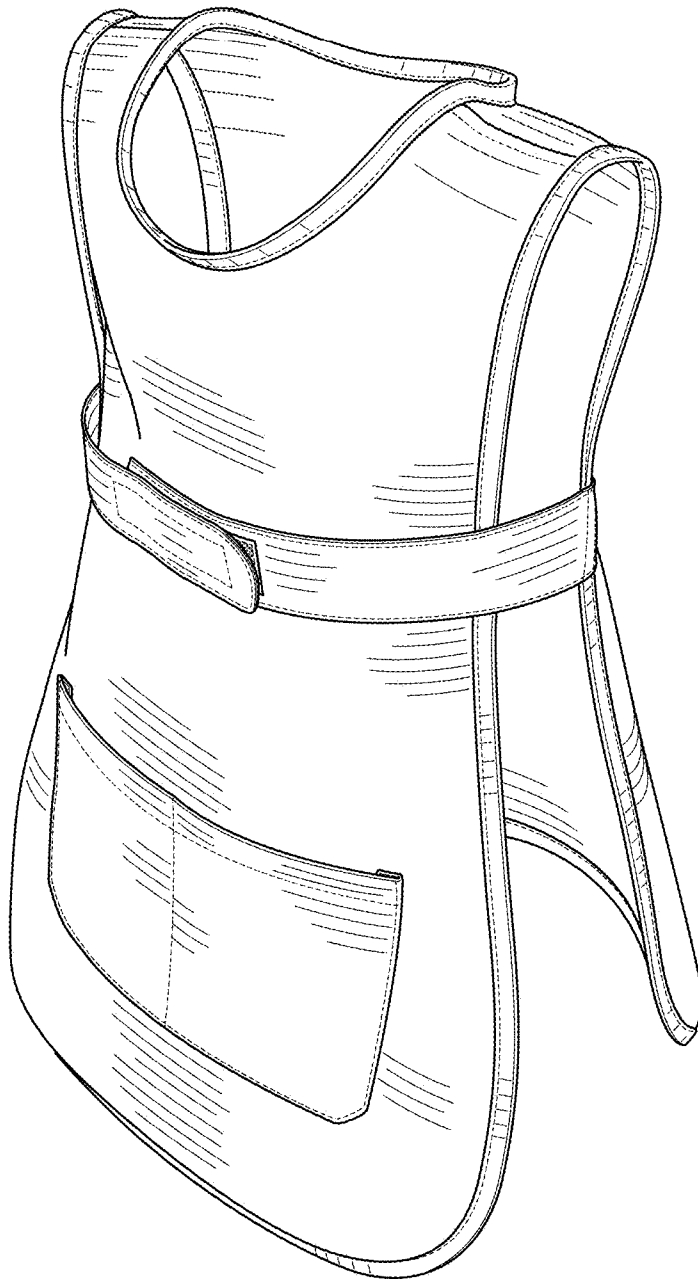

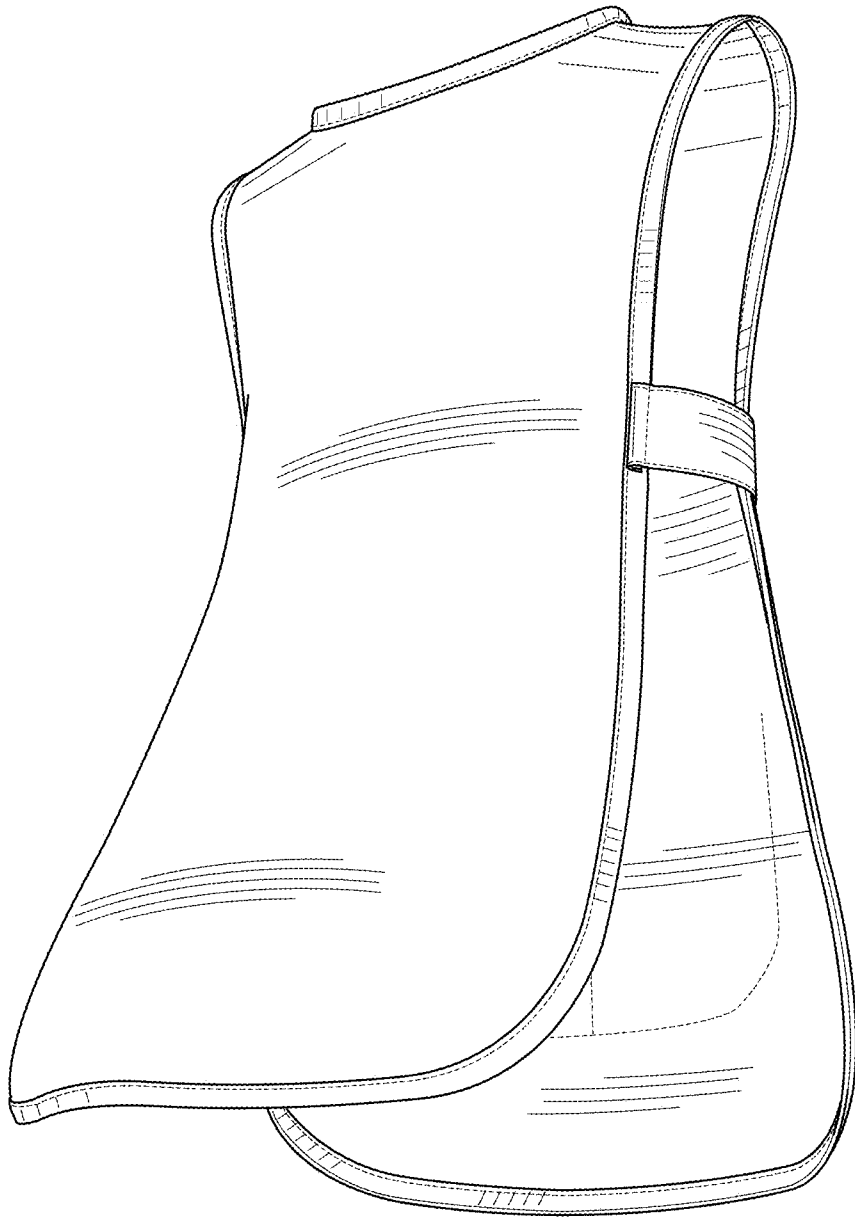

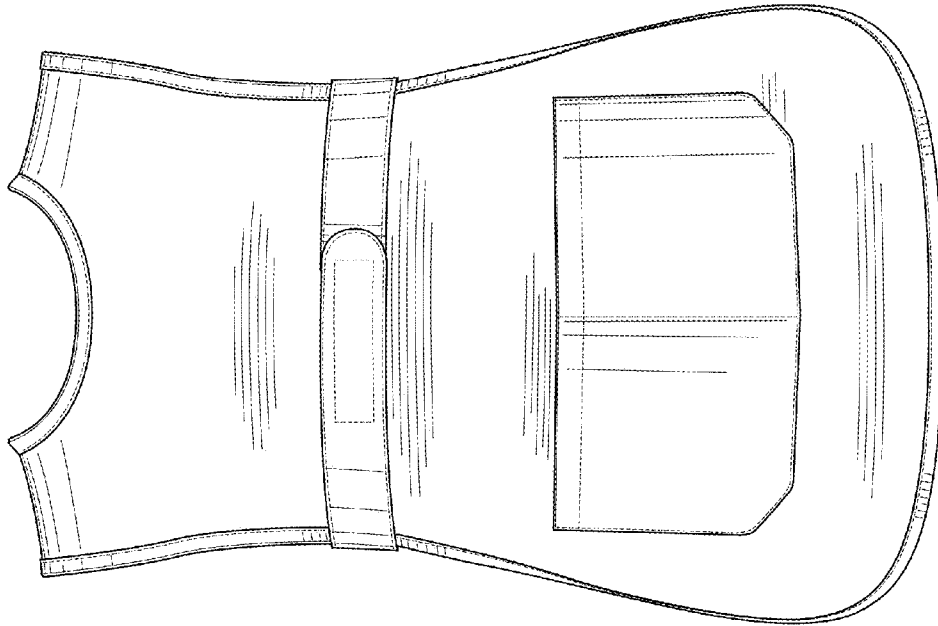

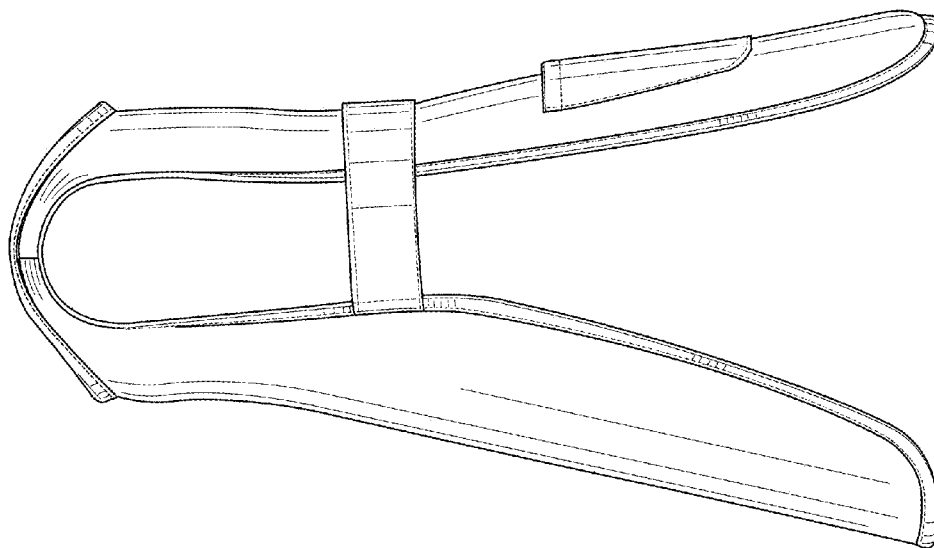

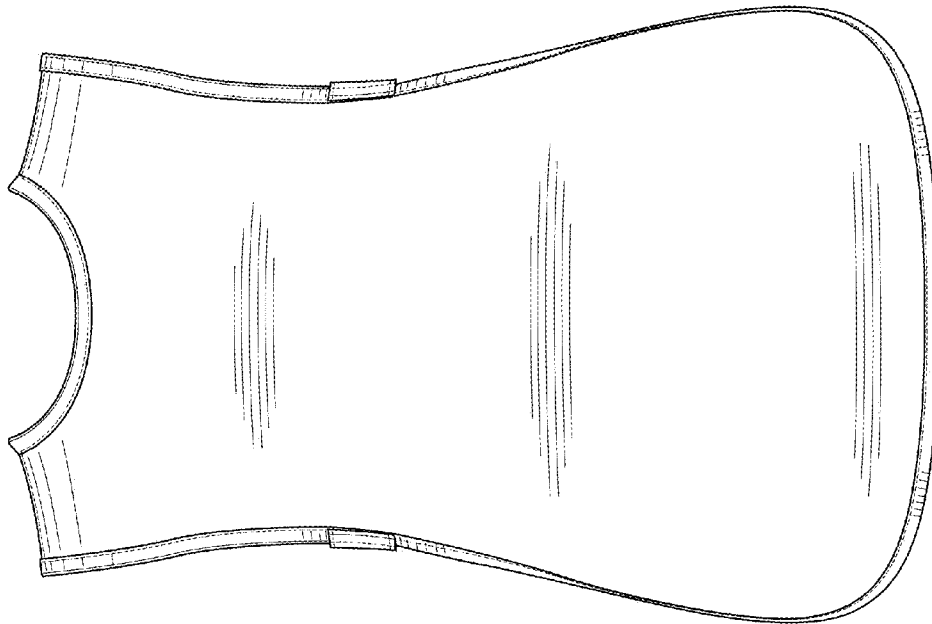

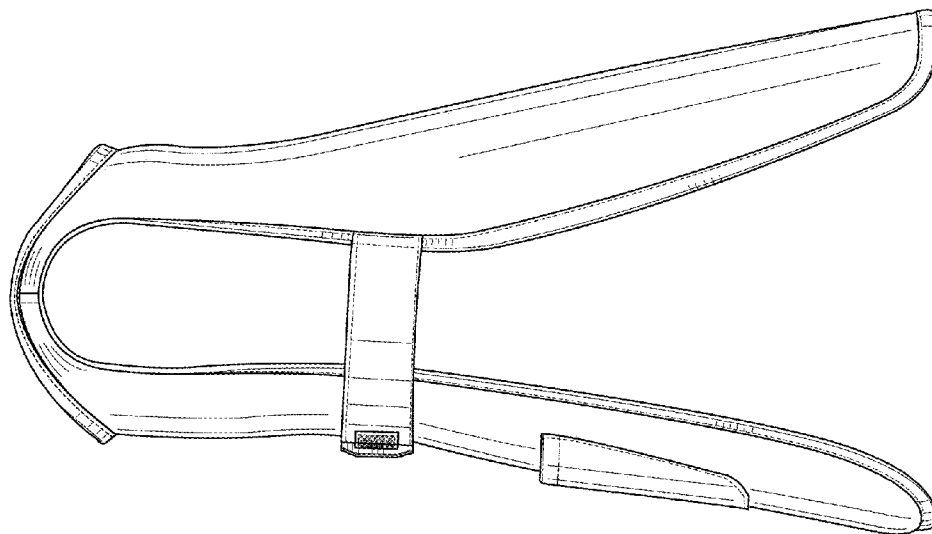

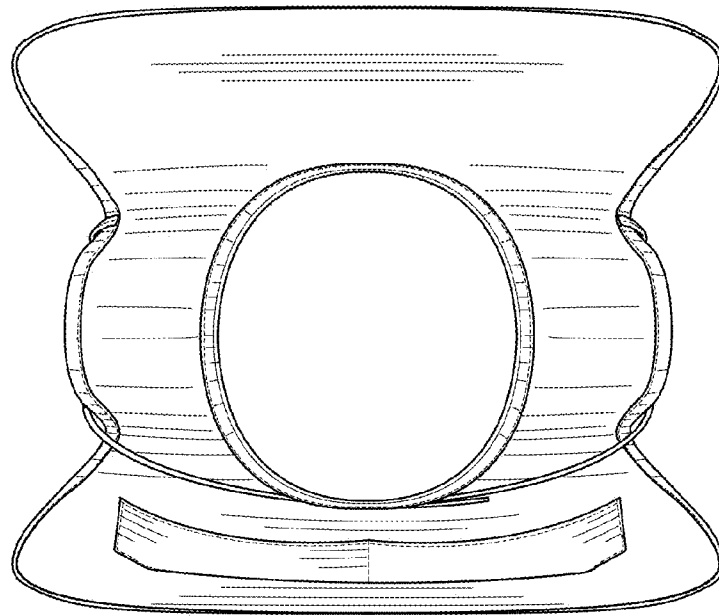

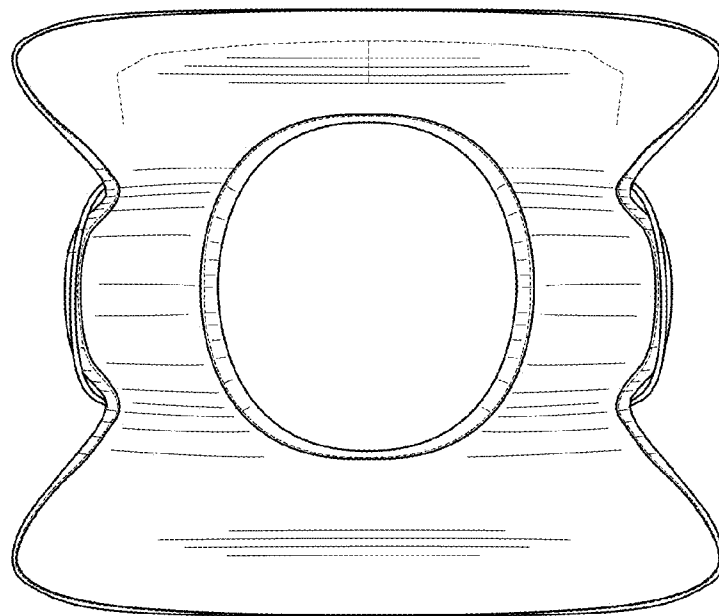
