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

(54) Title: REMOVABLE VEIN FILTER



(57) Abstract: The present provides a removable vessel filter comprising a first and second filtering portion and a first and second anchoring portion, wherein a transverse dimension of the first filtering portion in an expanded configuration is less than a transverse dimension of the first achoring portion in an expanded configuration, and a transverse dimension of the second filtering portion is less than a transverse dimension of the second anchoring portion. The first and second filtering portions are positioned closer to each other than the first and second anchoring portions, and the anchoring portions being formed on first and second opposite portions of the vessel filter. The vessel filter is removable from a vessel wall by engagement of either the first filtering portion ro the second filtering portion.

Claims Nos.: 7-62

In view of the large number and also the wording of the claims presently on file, which render it difficult, if not impossible, to determine the matter for which protection is sought, the present application fails to comply with the clarity and conciseness requirements of Article 6 PCT (see also Rule 6.1(a) PCT) to such an extent that a meaningful search is impossible.

Consequently, the search has been carried out for those parts of the application which do appear to be clear (and concise), namely claims 1-6. Independent claim 1 describes a vessel filter with a wire mounting section configured to engage a wall of a vessel, a wire filtering section configured to trap blood clots and a tubular member positioned on the wire mounting section and having a first sharpened end for contacting the vessel wall to help retain the wire mounting section.

The applicant's attention is drawn to the fact that claims, or parts of claims, relating to inventions in respect of which no international search report has been established need not be the subject of an international preliminary examination (Rule 66.1(e) PCT).
