

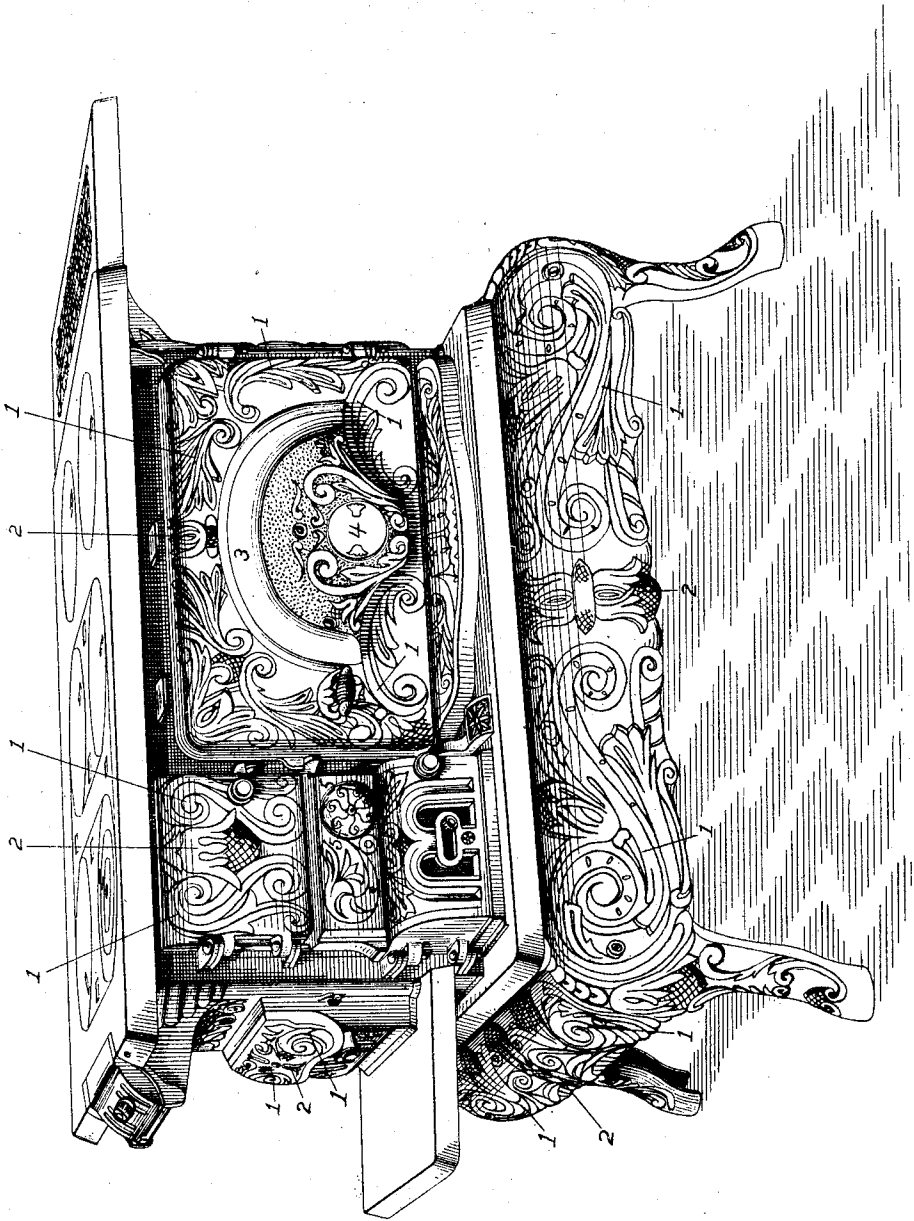

DESIGN FOR A STOVE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 36,082, dated September 23, 1902.

Application filed August 26, 1902. Serial No. 121,154. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MORRIS MAGEN, a citizen of the United States, residing in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented and produced a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Stove, of which the following is a specification.

My design is fully shown in the accompanying drawing, which represents a perspective view of the stove.

The essential features of the design are the foliated scrolls 1 and the ornamental figures 2, consisting of conventionalized leaves with projecting body resembling the fruit of a pine-apple, the skirting of the stove and the various doors of the same, excepting the intermediate door on the side, showing these features. The oven-door has also a projecting

hood 3 with central medallion 4 and scroll ornamentation, and the intermediate door on the side of the stove has a scroll ornament and a decorated boss 5.

Having thus described my invention, I claim and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The ornamental design for a stove, substantially as described and as shown in the accompanying drawing.
