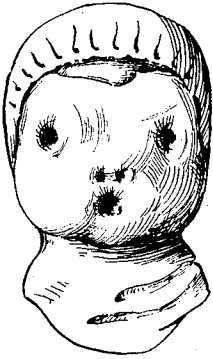

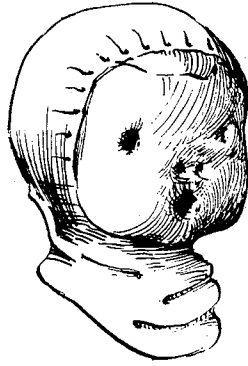

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GRACE M. QUACKENBUSH, a citizen of the United States, residing at New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for an Ornamental Head Adapted to be Applied to Any Article of Manufacture, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing and model, forming part thereof.

In the drawings, Figures 1 and 2 show

different views of my design looking at different sides thereof.

A distinctive feature of the design is that the eyes, nostrils and mouth of the face are formed by small indentations in the surface.

I claim:

The ornamental design for an ornamental head, as shown and described.
