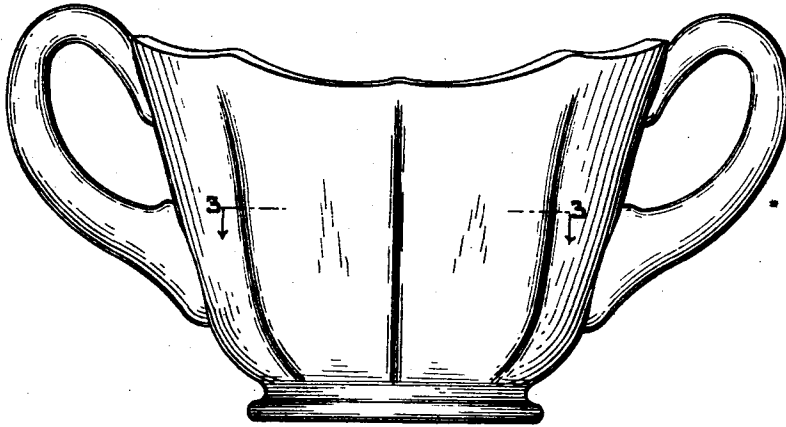

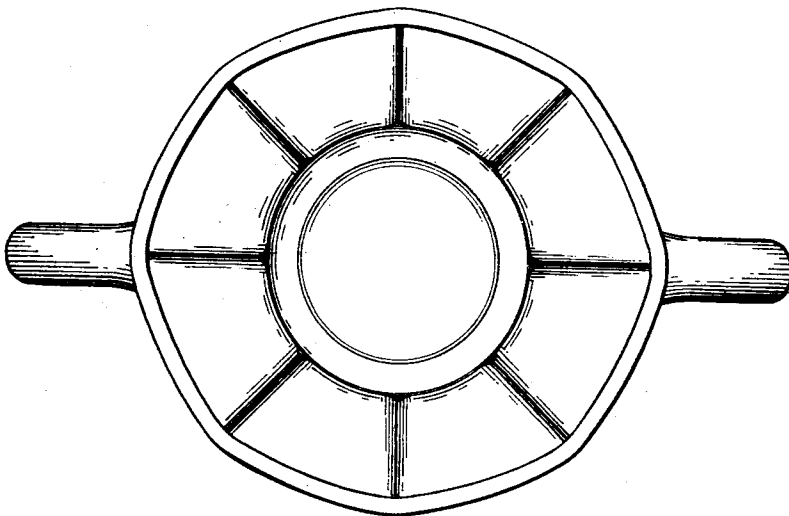

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, JOHN E. MILLER, a citizen of the United States, and residing at Washington, in the county of Washington and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a certain new, original, and ornamental Design for a Glass Vessel, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming a part thereof, wherein—

Figure 1 is a side elevation of the vessel.

Fig. 2 is a view in top plan of the same. Fig. 3 is a sectional view of a portion of the vessel, taken on line 3—3 of Fig. 1.
