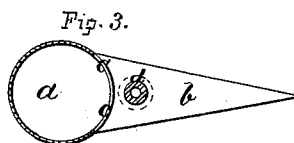
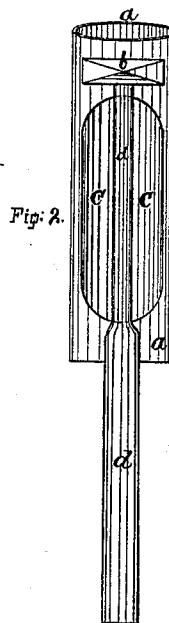
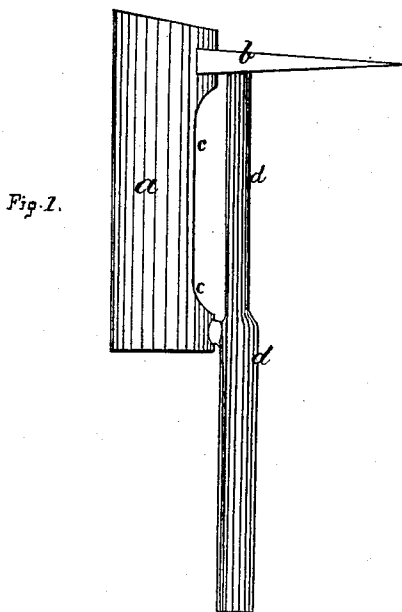

IMPROVEMENT IN COMBINED ICE PICKS AND SCOOPS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **149,417**, dated April 7, 1874; application filed March 21, 1874.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, NICOLAUS SCHROEDER, of the city of Davenport, in the county of Scott and State of Iowa, have invented certain Improvements in Combined Ice-Pick and Scoop, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings.

The object of my invention is to form a pick in connection with a scoop, so that if anything is loosened by the pick it may be removed by the connected scoop.

In soda-water stands and similar establishments the ice has to be used in small and fine quantities; also, in grocery stores, &c., the sugar, &c., in the barrel is usually hard. With this combination the substance may be loosened with the pick and removed with the scoop without using several instruments.

In the drawings, Figure 1 is the side view; Fig. 2, the view from the top of the scoop; Fig. 3, the section.

a is the scoop, with the hole *c* on top for the purpose of cleaning. *b* is the pick; *d*, the handle.

The material used is galvanized iron or similar material. The front of the scoop and the lower end of the pick are of steel. Smaller ones of this combined pick and scoop may be used for ice, and larger ones for sugar.

I claim as my invention—

The combination of a pick and scoop, substantially as described.
