

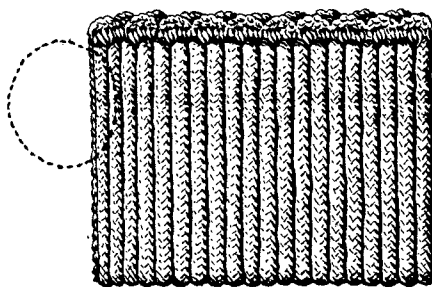

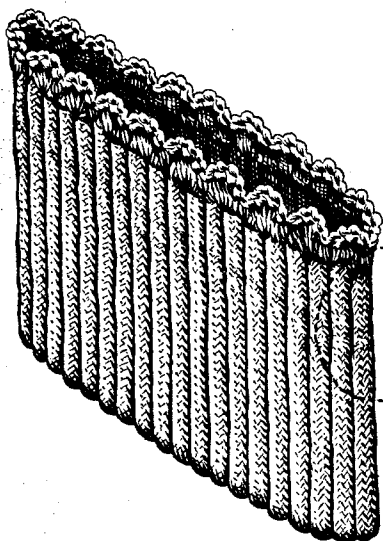

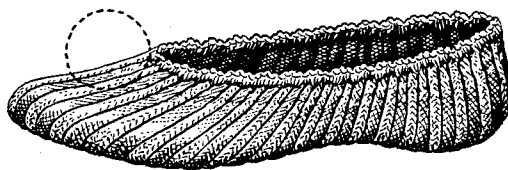

### DESIGN FOR A SLIPPER SOCK

Application filed September 30, 1931. Serial No. 41,267. Term of patent 14 years.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, HENRY BELLAK, a citizen of the United States, residing at Chicago, Cook County, Illinois, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Slipper Sock, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof.

Figure 1 is a side view of an article of footwear embodying my new design;

Figure 2 is a perspective view of the article; and

Figure 3 is an illustration of the article as it appears when worn.

The dotted lines in the drawings represent a pom-pom.
