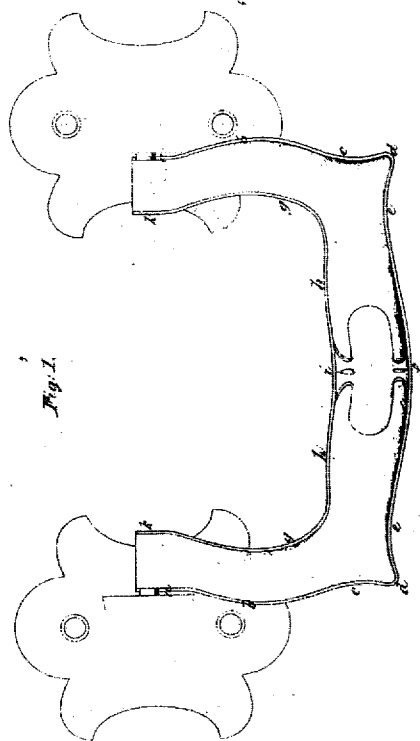

Design for Coffin Heads.

The schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Daniel A. Clark, of Pawtucket in the County of Providence and State of Rhode Island, have invented a new and useful design for Coffin and other Trimings; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear and exact description thereof, which will enable those skilled in the art to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings forming part of this specification, in which

Figure 1, is a side sectional elevation of my improved design.

Figures 2 and 3 are plan views thereof.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts. The object of my improvement is to provide an ornamental device or covering for the heads of the nails or screws as used in fastening the parts of coffins, picture frames, boxes and other articles; which device may also be employed for the ornamentation of the exterior surfaces of the above named and other articles.

I provide a raised and rounded head A, of any suitable wood of any desirable color, and in the centre or apex thereof I introduce a small metallic rounded eye or head B of a different color from the head A, so that the contrast in size and color between the two heads will produce an ornamental effect.

I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent.

The ornamental design herein described for coffin and other trimmings.
