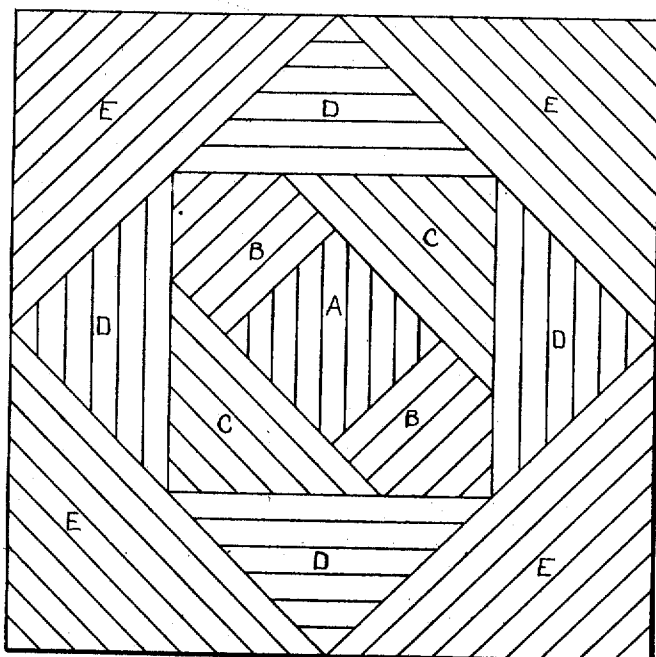

DESIGN FOR A FABRIC.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 34,358, dated April 9, 1901.

Application filed February 25, 1901. Serial No. 48,861. Term of patent 3½ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MARY M. HALL, a citizen of the United States, residing at Millbury, in the county of Worcester and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new and useful Design for Fabrics, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

The drawing shows a plan view of a fabric embodying my design.

As shown in the drawing, the leading or material feature of my design consists of a series of bands or stripes, which are arranged to form two concentric squares and two concentric diagonal squares or diamonds.

Surrounding the central diamond A of the design, so as to form the first upright square, are pentagonal figures B and triangles C. Surrounding the first upright square, so as to

form the second diamond, are triangular figures D, of substantially the same area as the triangle C, and surrounding the second diamond, so as to form the complete square of the design, are larger triangles E.

Having thus fully described my design for fabrics, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States, is—

The design for a fabric substantially as herein shown and described.
