

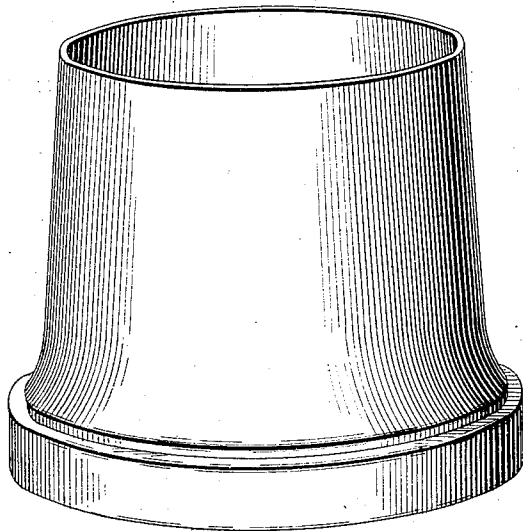

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM S. HAMM, a citizen of the United States, residing at Hubbard Woods, county of Cook, and State of Illinois, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Base for Automobile-Lamps, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part thereof and showing a perspective of the base viewed from above.

The distinctive characteristic of the design is that the base has the form of a truncated cone of slight taper.

I claim—

The ornamental design for a base for automobile lamps, as shown and described.
