LIQUID PREPARATION FOR REMOVING PAINT.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that WILLIAM J. TENNIS, a citizen of the United States, residing at Oelwein, in the county of Fayette and State of Iowa, has invented certain new and useful Improvements in Liquid Preparations for Removing Paint, of which the following is a specification.

This invention relates to a liquid preparation for removing paint, varnish and enamel and consists of the following ingredients combined in substantially the proportions specified:

Denatured alcohol, two quarts; benzol, three and three-fourths pints; sulphuric acid, one-fourth pint; paraffin, one-fourth ounce; soap, three ounces.

The ingredients are thoroughly mixed to-

gether by churning process and the preparation applied with a brush or spray after which the paint, varnish or enamel is scraped off with a knife or steel brush.

Having described my invention what I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is:

A liquid preparation for removing paint, varnish and enamel, consisting of denatured alcohol, benzol, sulphuric acid, paraffin and soap, combined in substantially the following proportions: denatured alcohol, two quarts; benzol, three and three-fourths pints; sulphuric acid, one-fourth pint; paraffin, one-fourth ounce; soap, three ounces.
