




Sherman S Jewett & Francis M Root Buffalo, N.Y.
Letters Patent (Design 91) dated 3^d October 1846

The schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and marking part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, Sherman S Jewett and Francis M Root of Buffalo in the County of Erie in the State of New York have invented and produced a new and useful design of a stove, which in its general shape and configuration resembles that which is usually denominated the nine plate stove; and we do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description of the shape or configuration thereof and of the ornaments thereon.

Fig 1. of the accompanying drawings is a side elevation of said stove; fig 2, a front elevation thereof; fig 3 a plan of the top plate, and fig 4 a plan of the hearth or bottom plate. In fig 1. the door A, has a panel consisting of the wrought-iron flowers and leafing seen at B, surrounded by the border C, and the ornamental rim D.D. Below this on the side plate is the panel E, the flowers and leafing on which are the same with those on the panel B, and this is surrounded by the border C, which is the same in character with that so marked on the upper panel. At each end of the side plates there is a running vine rising from a vase like stand as shown at F.F. The top of the side and end plates curve out, forming a kind of cornice, and having

on it the ornaments *C, C*.

In the front elevation fig. 2. *H*, is the door of the fire chamber which is furnished with an ornamental panel and border as represented, and above this is the ornamental panel *I*. The back plate is similar to the front with this difference only that there not being any door, it has on it two panels the same with that marked *I*. The corners of the stove are rounded and have on them the ornamental wrought-iron *R, R*.

The top plate fig. 3, has around its edge the ornamental border *K, K*, and within this the wrought-iron moulding *L, L* surrounding a panel having a collar on it for a stove pipe, and a boiler opening through it.

Fig. 4, which is a top view of the hearth or bottom plate, has the shape or configuration represented and is surrounded by an ornamental border *M, M*.

Having herein fully set forth and represented the configuration of our stove and the manner in which we form and distribute the ornaments thereon, what we claim as new and desire to secure by letter patent, is the exclusive right to a stove so formed and ornamented; and this we claim whether the whole of the ornamental plates be used, or such portion of them only as constitute a substantial part of our stove.
