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
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(54) Title: KEYPAD FOR PROVIDING TACTILE FEEDBACK FOR USE WITH A TOUCH SCREEN



(57) Abstract: A keypad including an elastic sheet for disposing on a touch screen, the sheet including at least one key member shaped to define a space within the key member for providing tactile feedback when the key member is depressed and contacts the touch screen and a mounting element, for mounting the elastic sheet on the touch screen, coupled to the elastic sheet.
