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(54) Title: SUBSTITUTED HYDROXYETHYLAMINE ASPARTYL PROTEASE INHIBITORS

(57) Abstract: The invention relates to novel compounds and also to methods of treating at least one disease, disorder, or condition associated with amyloidosis using such compounds. Amyloidosis refers to a collection of diseases, disorders, and conditions associated with abnormal deposition of A-beta protein.
