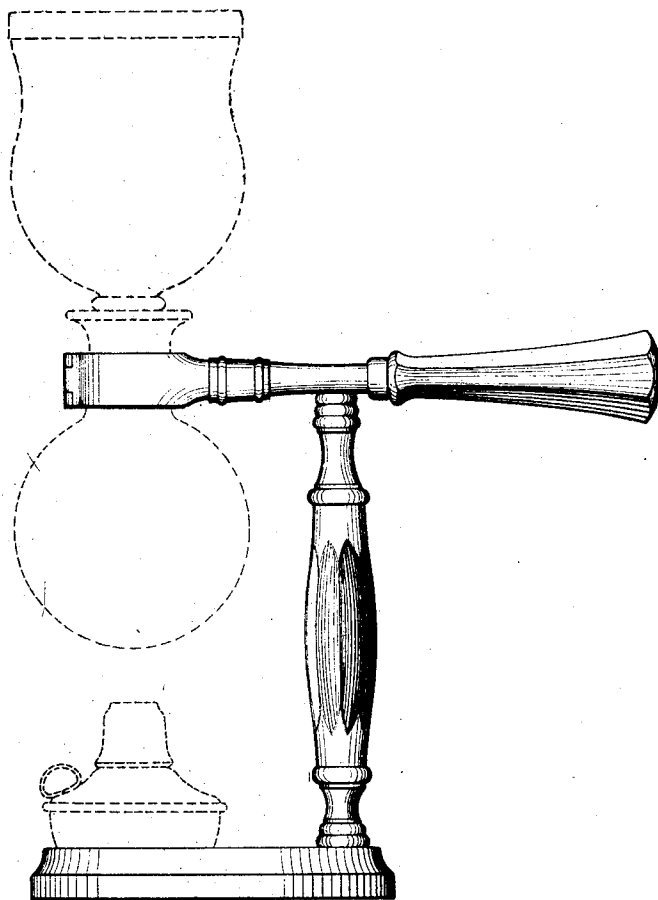

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE E. CURTISS, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of New Britain, in the county of Hartford, State of Connecticut, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Standard for Coffee-Machines, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part hereof.
