

IMPROVEMENT IN TEASLING-MACHINE.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, Edwin Birkenshaw, of Ashuelot, in the county of Cheshire, and in the State of New Hampshire, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Teasle-Machines; and do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and the letters of reference marked thereon.

In the annexed drawings, making a part of this specification-

A represents a section of a teasling-gig cylinder, and

B represents the teasling-gig slats.

The cylinder A is provided with or has a series of hooks or catches, C C, attached to it at suitable distances apart, and all standing or facing one way, as shown.

The slats B are provided with projections, or have some of the cross-pieces extended out so as to slide and catch under the hooks C C. Said gig-slat is made in the usual manner and form for holding the "teasle."

D represents a spring provided with a lip or catch, and is secured to the cylinder A just beneath one end of the slats B when adjusted, and catches the end of said slats and holds them in place.

To detach or adjust the slats B, I press the spring D down and slide the slats out or in from or to the hooks C C, which is very quickly and readily done, as will be seen.

Having thus fully described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is-The spring D and hooks C C for holding or attaching the gig-slats B, the teasling-gig cylinder A, when constructed and arranged substantially as herein specified.
