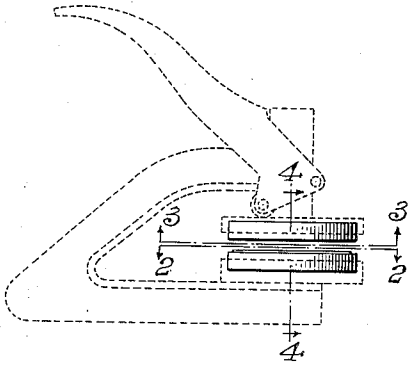

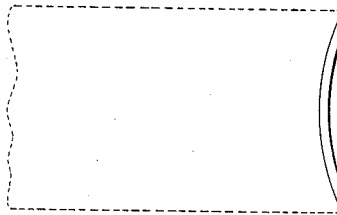
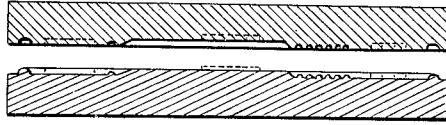
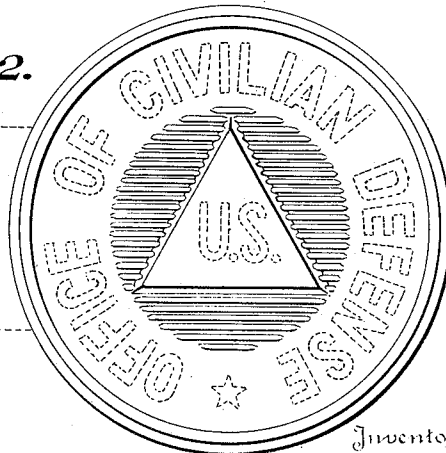
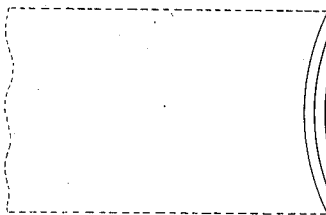

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, Walter P. Burn, a citizen of the United States and a resident of Washington, in the District of Columbia, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Seal Impressing Device or Similar Article, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

Fig. 1 is a side elevational view of a seal impressing device showing my new design;

Fig. 2 is a somewhat enlarged sectional view taken on line 2—2 of Fig. 1;

Fig. 3 is a sectional view taken on line 3—3 of Fig. 1, to the same scale as Fig. 2, and

Fig. 4 is a somewhat enlarged sectional view taken on the line 4—4 of Fig. 1.

The characteristic features of my design are shown in full lines in the drawing.

I claim:

The ornamental design for a seal impressing device or similar article, as shown and described.
