

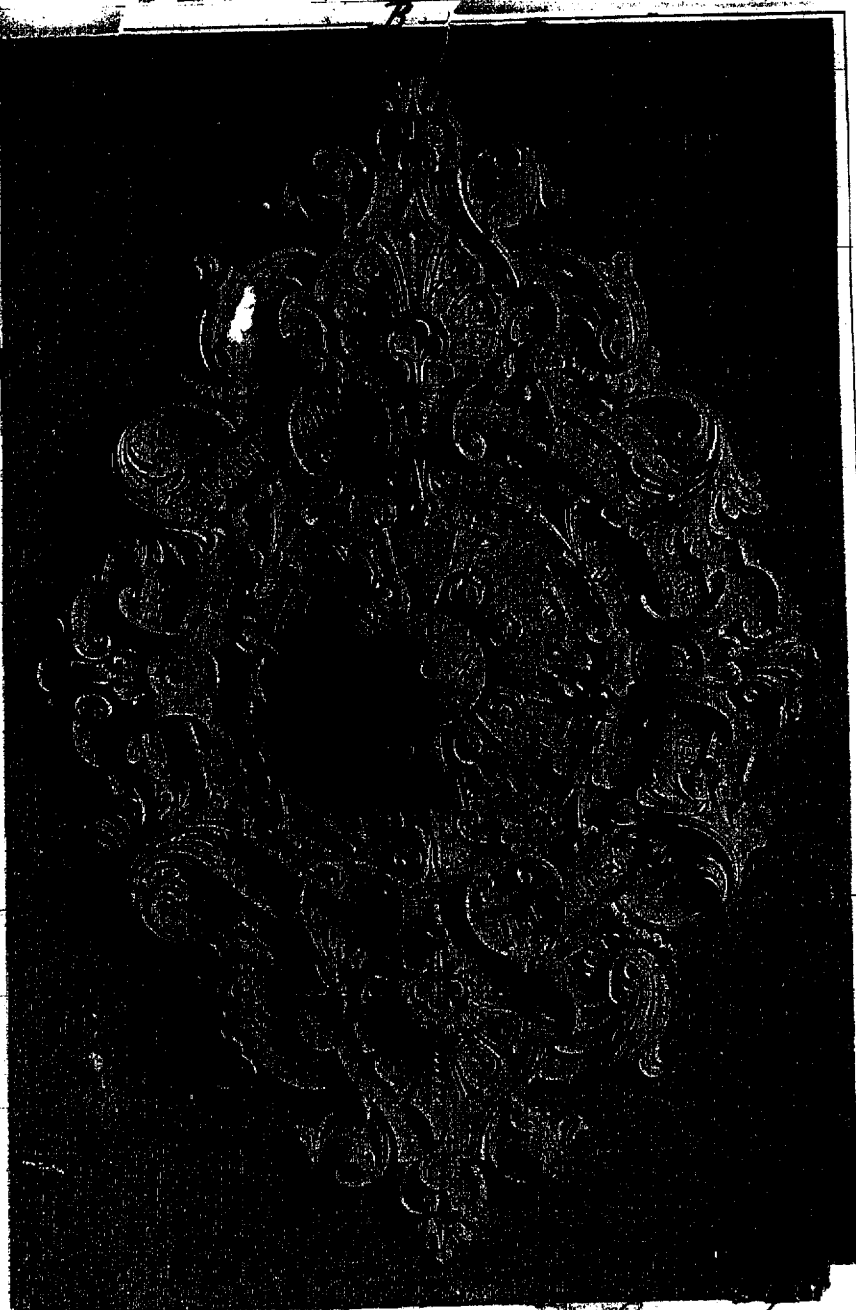

DESIGN FOR A CENTRE-PIECE.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, HENRY BERGER, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for Centre-Pieces; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable those skilled in the art to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part of this specification.

The drawing represents a plan of this design.

This design consists of a button, A, surrounded by arabesques, B, and forming the centre of a ring, C, the face and rim of which are embellished by ornamental lines *a*.

The ring is partially covered by a wreath, D, and

intermediate arabesques, E, and from two opposite sides of said ring project ornamental escutcheons, F, whereby the form of the centre-piece is rendered oblong.

Having thus described my invention,

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a centre-piece, as shown and described.
