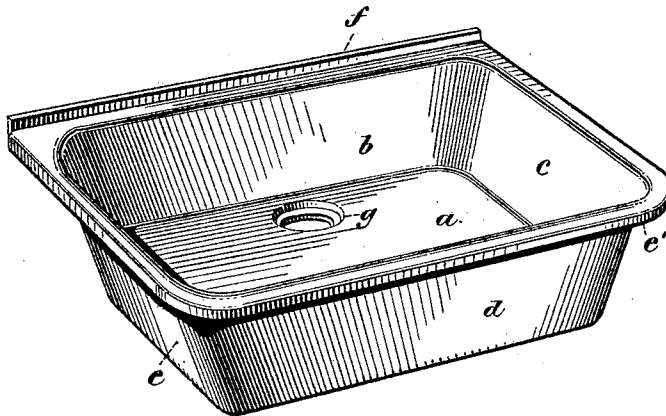
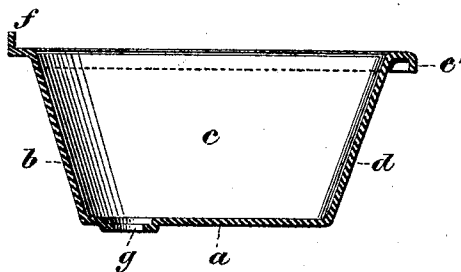

DESIGN FOR A SINK.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 25,035, dated December 31, 1895.

Application filed November 15, 1895. Serial No. 569,119. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, EDWARD W. BALL, residing in Wood Haven, Queens county, and JAMES COCHRAN, residing in Brooklyn, Kings county, State of New York, citizens of the United States, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Sink, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description.

The leading feature of our design is a sink of substantially the configuration and representation shown in the accompanying drawings, in which—

Figure 1 is a perspective view of the sink embodying our design, and Fig. 2 is a section thereof.

In the drawings, *a* is the floor of the sink, from which rise the walls *b c d e* having the angular edges *e'* and *f*, the edge *e'* being turned down on the sides of the sink and the edge *f* being on the remaining turned-up side and the perforation *g* in the floor.

What we claim is—

The design for a sink, substantially as herein shown and described.
