





DESIGN FOR A DRESS ENSEMBLE

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Ann Verdi, a citizen of the United States, residing in Jackson Heights, Long Island, in the county of Queens and State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Dress Ensemble, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof.

Figure 1 is a front view of a dress ensemble, showing my new design; and

Figure 2 is a rear view of Figure 1.

Figure 3 is a front view of the dress member of the ensemble shown in Figure 1; and
