

DESIGN FOR A SIGN-BOARD.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 22,053, dated December 6, 1892.

Application filed August 29, 1892. Serial No. 444,454. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM GOESSLING, a citizen of the United States, residing in the city of St. Louis, State of Missouri, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Sign-Boards, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part of this specification, wherein is represented a perspective view of a sign-board, showing my design.

My design consists in a sign-board comprising the representation of a square wind-filled sail bent to its yards with associated hal-yards and mast, which are painted or otherwise represented on the board, which forms a background for relieving the sail.

A represents the sign-board on which the design is painted or otherwise represented, which board forms a background for the sail.

B represents the post upon which the board is supported.

C represents the background formed by the board.

D is the sail.

E is the mast.

F is the head-yard, and G a flying pennant.

I claim—

The design for sign-boards, substantially as herein shown and described.
