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

(54) Title: A CONTEXT INFORMATION PROCESSING SYSTEM USED FOR ACCESSING MEDICAL DATA



(57) Abstract: A context information processing system used for accessing medical data includes an acquisition processor for acquiring configuration information indicating a type of a particular patient identification tag reader device of a plurality of different types of tag reader device and a format of patient identification data used by the particular patient identification tag reader device. An interpreter processes patient identification data received from the particular patient identification tag reader device using the received configuration information to provide a particular patient identifier. A context processor updates a record indicating that a current patient context, including a patient identifier, is compatible with the particular patient identifier.
