

DESIGN FOR BOXES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 11,057, dated March 4, 1879; application filed January 27, 1879.

[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, August Wuensch, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a certain new and original Design for Boxes, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design consists in giving the face of the box the form, configuration, and outline shown at A in the accompanying drawing, the same projecting at points beyond the edges of the box-body, and representing a clock-front, and in forming on such front a calendar in the shape of a clock-dial, B, provided with hands or pointers C. The complete design is shown clearly in the accompa-

nying drawing, to which reference may be had for its several features.

I claim—

The design for boxes, consisting of the face A, with projecting moldings, the calendar B, and hands C, as herein described, and as illustrated in and by the accompanying drawing.
