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

(54) Title: DISPLAY/LAYOUT METHODS AND APPARATUSES INCLUDING CONTENT ITEMS AND DISPLAY CONTAINERS



(57) Abstract: Methods and apparatuses for generating layout specifications with layout generator (312) for content items to be rendered, using display containers (314), and/or rendering the content items using the generated rendering layout specification are disclosed. In various embodiments, the generating of a rendering layout specification may include one or more of selecting a display container for a content item, selecting a content item for a display container (314), and selecting a display container for a display container.
