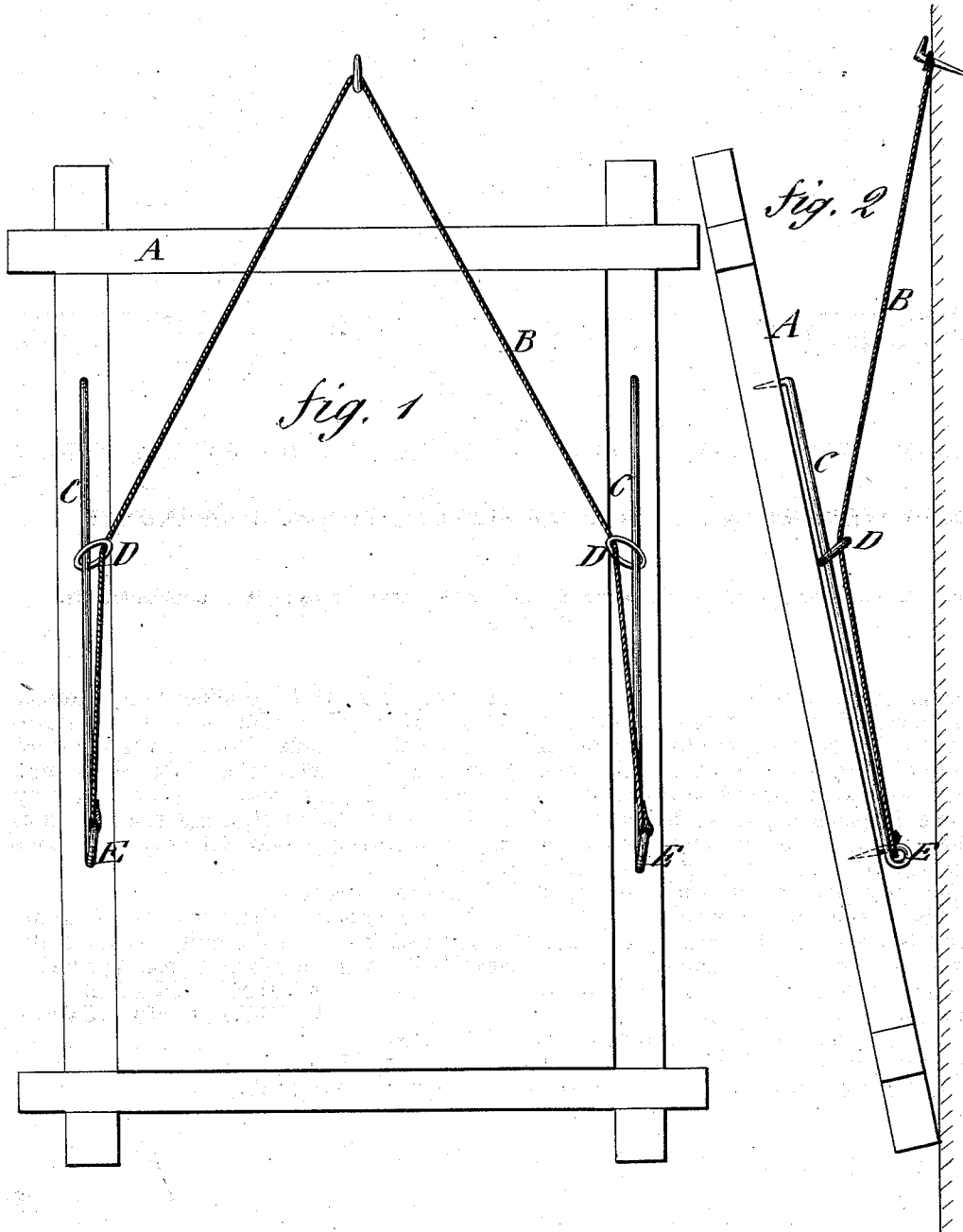

IMPROVEMENT IN ADJUSTABLE PICTURE-FRAME SUSPENDERS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **155,648**, dated October 6, 1874; application filed July 25, 1874.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, ALBERT GORRELL and ROBERT J. MCCLURE, of Holmesville, in the county of Holmes and State of Ohio, have invented a new and Improved Adjustable Picture-Frame Suspender; and we do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part of this specification, in which—

Figure 1 is a view of the back of a frame. Fig. 2 is an edge view of the same.

The invention will first be fully described, and then pointed out in the claim.

A is the frame, and B the suspending-cord. C C are wires, rods, or strips of wood attached to the back of the frame, so as to allow the

adjusting-rings D D to slide freely thereon. At the lower ends of the wires are used eyes E, to which the ends of the suspending-cord B are attached before being passed through the rings D D. As the latter slide readily up or down, the points of suspension are thus readily and very quickly adjusted up or down the back.

What we claim is—

The combination, with picture-cord B attached to frame A, of the rails C C and slide-rings D D, as and for the purpose specified.
