AMANDA M. IRWIN, OF BROOKLYN, NEW YORK.

IMPROVEMENT IN MEDICAL COMPOUNDS OR PILE OINTMENTS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 120,879, dated November 14, 1871.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, AMANDA M. IRWIN, wife of James Irwin, of Brooklyn, county of Kings and State of New York, have invented a new and Improved Remedy or Cure for a disease commonly called the Piles; and I do declare that the following is a full and complete recipe or direction for the manufacture of the said remedy, and a full and complete statement of the component parts thereof, viz.:

Twelve ounces pulverized alum; twelve ounces pulverized nut-gall; sixteen ounces leaf lard—

the same to be mixed in said quantities and proportionally, without heating, and to be applied externally to and upon the part of the human person affected by the disease aforesaid.

I claim—

The compound or remedy herein described, composed of alum, nut-gall, and lard, and called by the name of "Mrs. Irwin's Pile Ointment."
