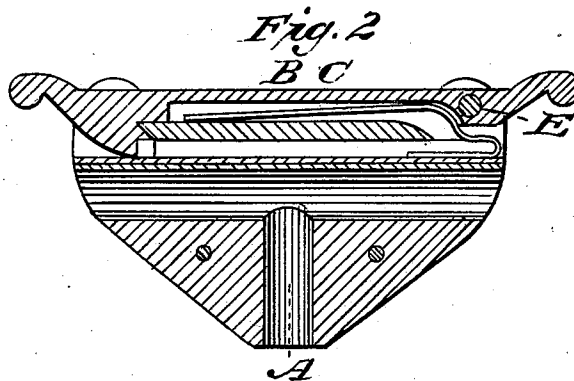
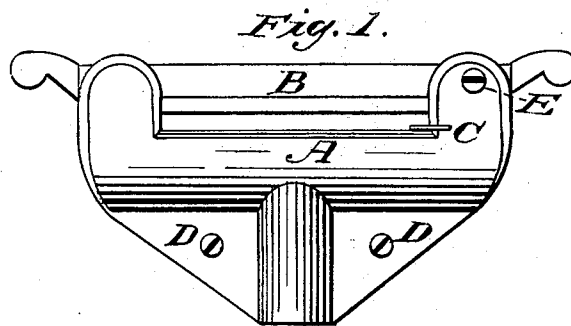

IMPROVEMENT IN REIN-HOLDERS.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES WHITTAKER, of Milwaukee, Milwaukee county, and State of Wisconsin, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Rein-Holder; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable those skilled in the art to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part of this specification, in which—

Figure 1 is a perspective view of my invention.

Figure 2, a sectional view.

Similar letters of reference, in each of the figures, indicate corresponding parts.

The object of my invention is to provide a neat and substantial rein-holder.

A, the main body of the rein-holder, B, the lock, and C, the spring; D, the screws which hold the holder

to the dash-board; E, screw which holds the lock in place.

Operation: Take out the screw D, and put the two parts, one on one side of the dash-board, and the other the other side of the dash-board, and put the screws in, and screw them up tight. This will hold the holder to the dash-board. When you stop, raise the loose end of the lock, and lay the reins under it, and let it fall back on to them, and they will remain secure till you want to use them again.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A rein-holder, consisting of the parts A, B, and C, substantially as described.
