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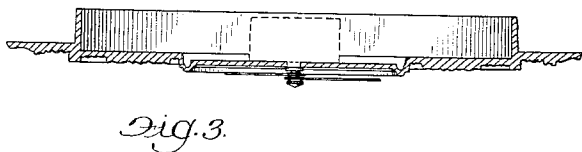
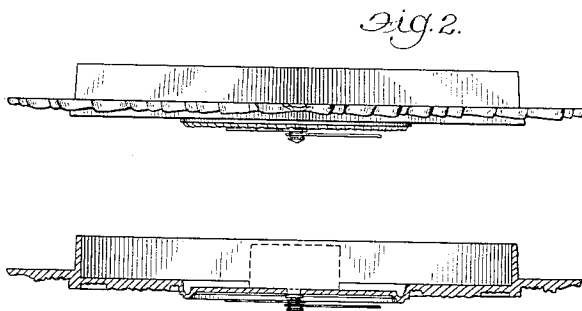
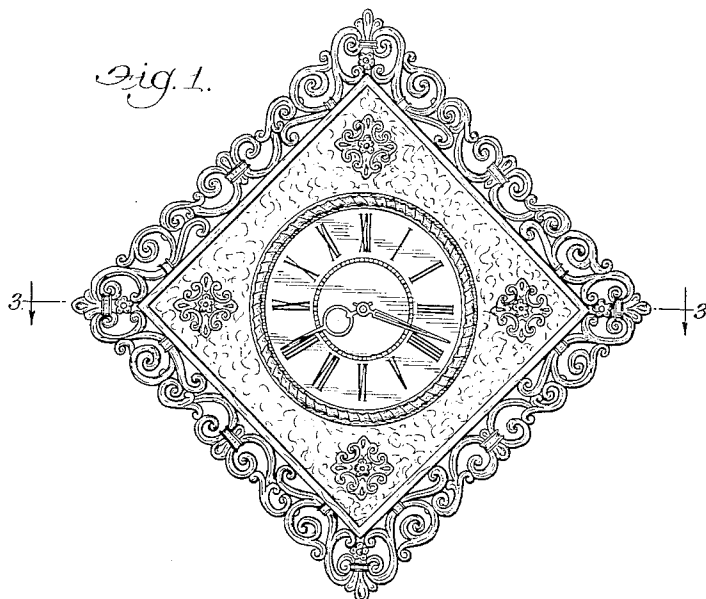


FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of a clock embodying my new design;
