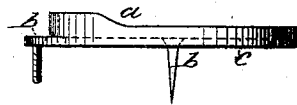
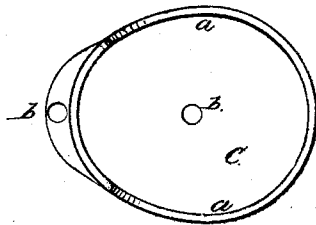

IMPROVEMENT IN STOVE-FOOT SHOES.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **140,576**, dated July 8, 1873; application filed December 7, 1872.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, A. D. COLES, of the city of Newark, in the county of Essex and State of New Jersey, have invented certain Improvements in a Shoe for the Feet of Stoves, of which the following is a specification:

The improvements relate to the construction of the stove-foot shoe for which a patent was allowed on the 3d day of December, 1872; and consists in the extension of the rim around the shoe, and in having one or more holes for nails or screws in the bottom of the shoe, one being in an extension outside of the rim, so that the shoe can be secured to the floor without having to move the stove from its place or to lift it to the height required by the length of the center-pin in my first patent.

In the accompanying drawing, Figure 1 is a top view, and Fig. 2 an edge view, of the improved shoe.

c is the base-plate, *a* the rim around its edge, projecting upward therefrom, and *b* the holes for nails or screws.

What I claim is—

The improved stove-foot shoe herein shown and described, consisting of the base-plate *c*, the rim *a* all around, and the holes *b*, all as set forth.
