

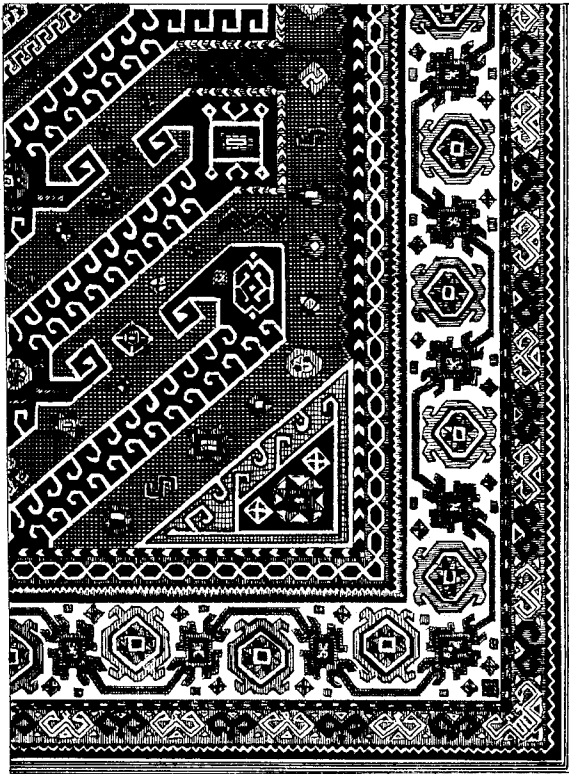

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, ADOLPH PETZOLD, a citizen of the United States, residing in the city of Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania, have invented a certain new, original, and ornamental Design for Rugs, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

The figure is a plan view of a quarter sec-

tion of an Axminster rug, the other three quarter sections being identical therewith, showing my new design.
