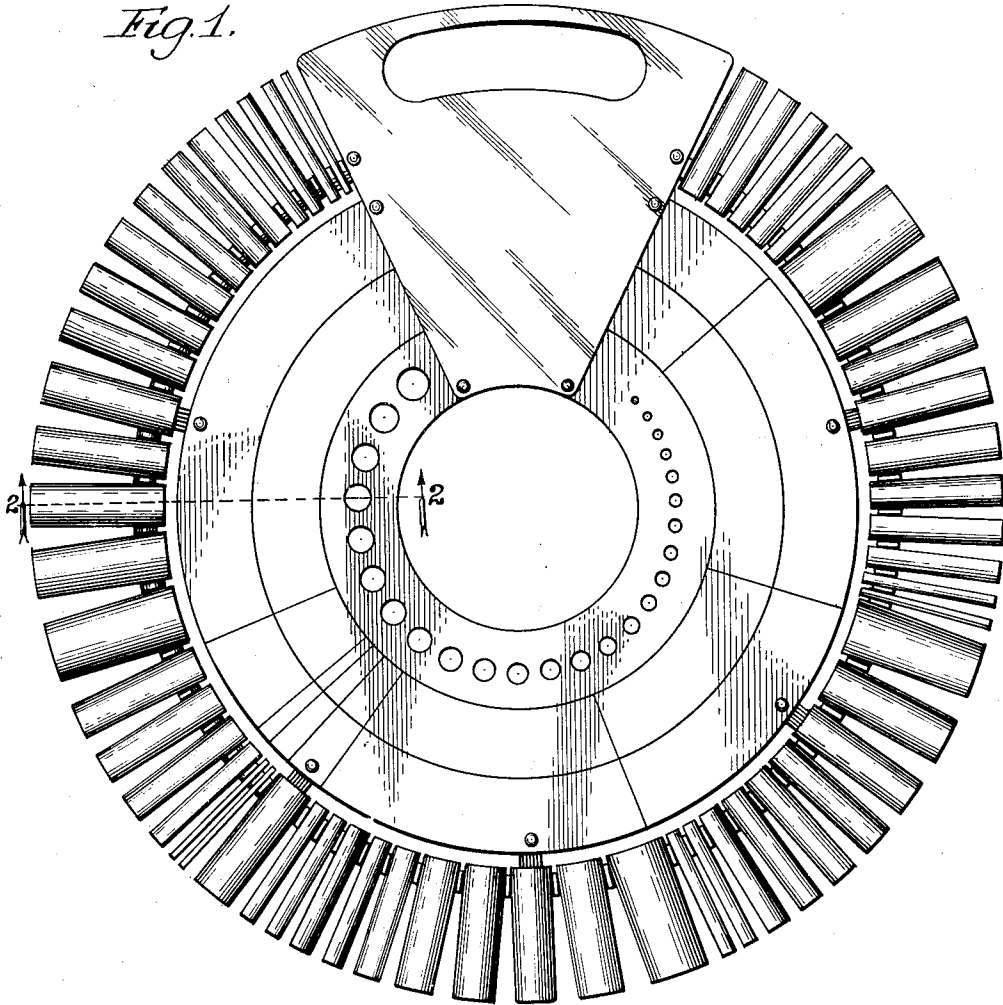
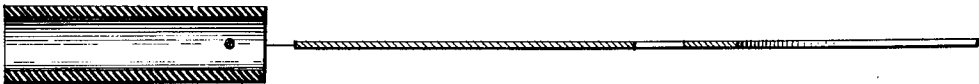

DESIGN FOR A COMBINED CARD AND TUBING DISPLAY

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Foster G. McGaw, a citizen of the United States, residing at Chicago, county of Cook, and State of Illinois, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Combined Card and Tubing Display, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part thereof, in which:

Figure 1 is a top plan view of a combined card

and tubing display showing my new design; and Figure 2 is an enlarged fragmentary transverse sectional view, taken along the line designated by numeral 2—2 and in the direction indicated by the arrows.
