## DESIGN FOR A PADLOCK-CASE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 16,614, dated April 13, 1886.

Application filed March 2, 1886. Serial No. 193,805. Term of patent 7 years.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, EDWIN C. MANNING, a citizen of the United States, residing at Washington, in the District of Columbia, have invented a certain new and original Design for a Padlock-Case, of which the following is a description.

The accompanying drawing shows my invention, which consists of a new and original design for a padlock-case, in the form of a closed or clinched hand, the parts thereof being respectively modeled to produce a pleasing and artistic result.

The entire case is represented by A, in which B shows the base or crown of the case, and C one of its opposite extremities, modeled

to represent the four clinched fingers of the human hand, while D shows the other extremity or lug of the case modeled to represent the closed thumb of a human hand.

What I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States, is—

The design for a padlock-case herein shown and described, the same consisting of a case representing a closed or clinched hand, as set forth, and having a base or crown, as B.
