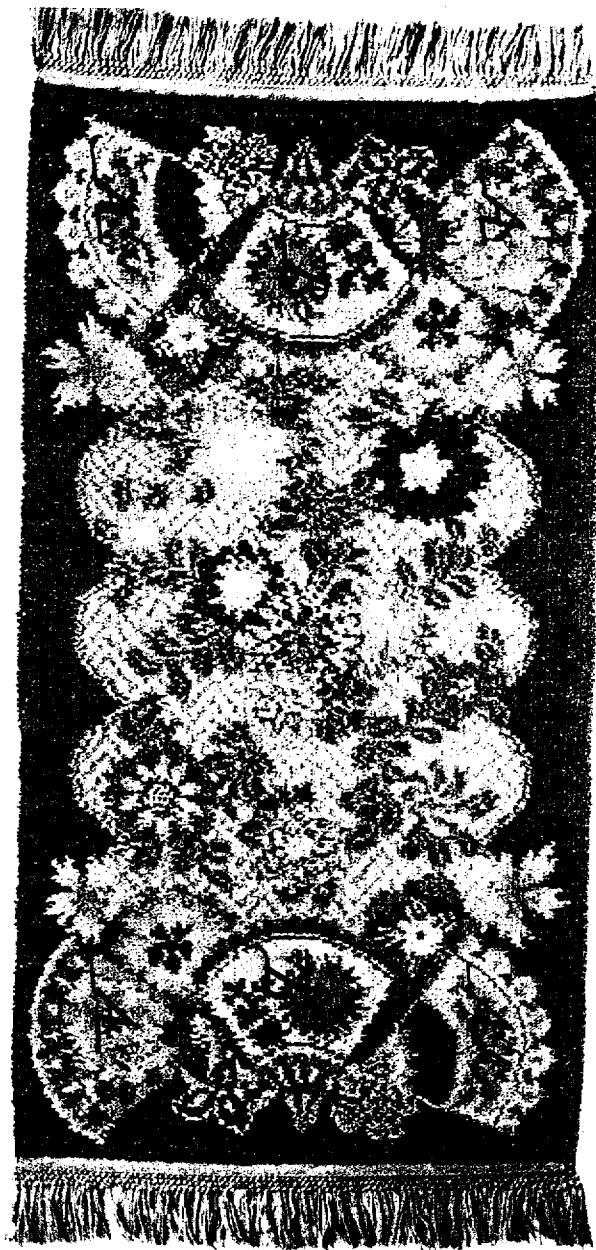

DESIGN FOR A RUG.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 16,640, dated April 20, 1886.

Application filed March 11, 1886. Serial No. 194,903. Term of patent 3½ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ADOLPH PETZOLD, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented
5 and produced a new and original Design for Rugs, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

10 In the illustration, A A' A" A''' are open fan-shaped figures situated at the corners of the design. B B are also open fan-shaped figures with the points or handle parts of the fans
15 turned outward toward the edges of the rug and the curved edges of the open fans turned inward. The intermediate space between the corner fans is filled with fret-work having spaces at intervals containing star-shaped
20 figures or flowers, the whole design being thrown into relief by a background of con-

trast in color to the foreground or design. The intermediate ground surrounded by the four corner fan-shaped figures may be filled with ornamentation of various kinds, which
25 will suggest itself to the mind of any person ordinarily skilled in the art; but the essential features of my design are the four open fan-shaped figures, one at each corner of the rug design, and the intermediate ornamented
30 space.

What I claim as new is—

A design for rugs consisting of the four open fan-shaped figures A A' A" A''', one at each corner of the rug design, the intermediate space between the fans being ornament-
35 ed, substantially as shown.
