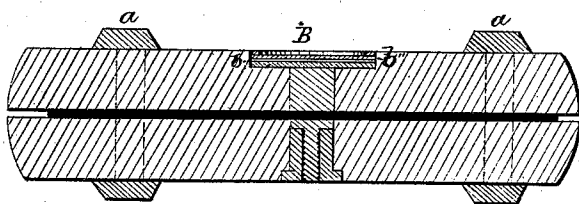
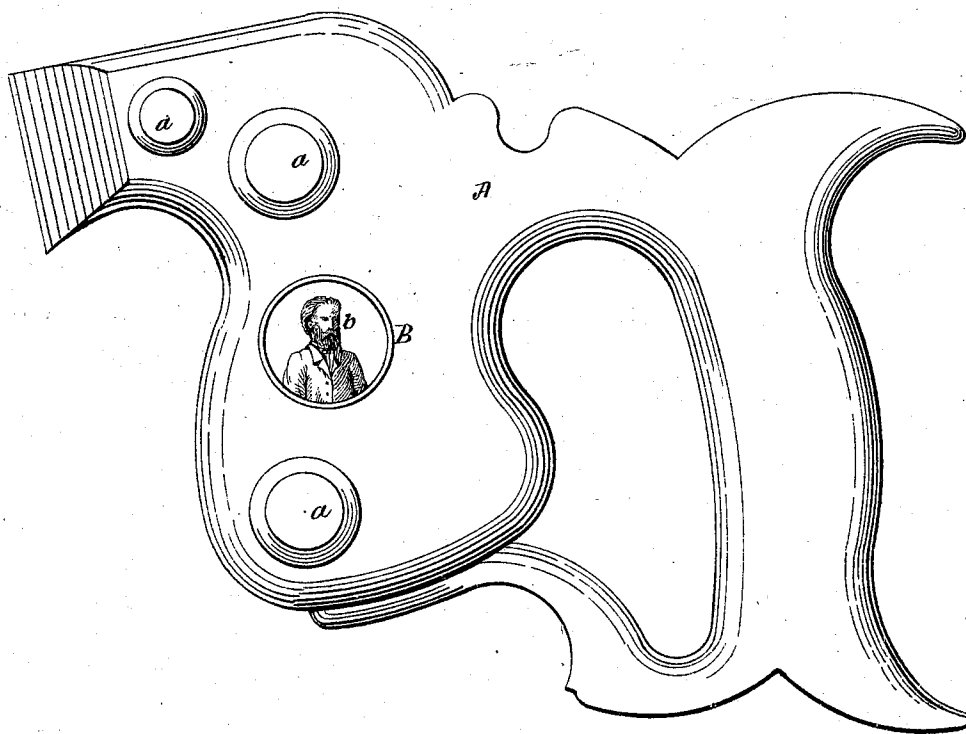

IMPROVEMENT IN PICTURE-RECEPTACLES FOR SAW-HANDLES.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **150,699**, dated May 13, 1874; application filed April 14, 1873.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM MILLSPAUGH, of Middletown, in the county of Orange, in the State of New York, have made certain Improvements in Saw-Handles, of which the following is a specification:

The object of this invention is to have a receptacle in the handle of the saw, in which is placed the picture of the manufacturer or owner thereof; and it consists in the picture-receptacle in the handle of a saw, as will be more fully hereinafter described.

In the drawings, Figure 1 represents the side of a saw-handle with the picture therein, and Fig. 2 represents a transverse section of same.

A is an ordinary handle of a saw. *aaa* are rivets that hold the handle fast to the saw-

blade. B is the picture-receptacle, made by boring out a place in the side of the handle, in which is placed the picture *b*, and secured in the handle so as to be water and air tight, and having a glass, *b'*, or other transparent substance before it, so that the picture can always be seen and be fully protected from the atmosphere or from breaking, and at the same time be easily removed from the handle.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The picture-receptacle B in saw-handle A, as and for the purpose described.
