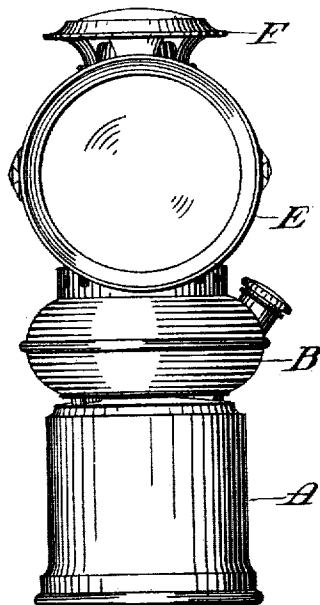

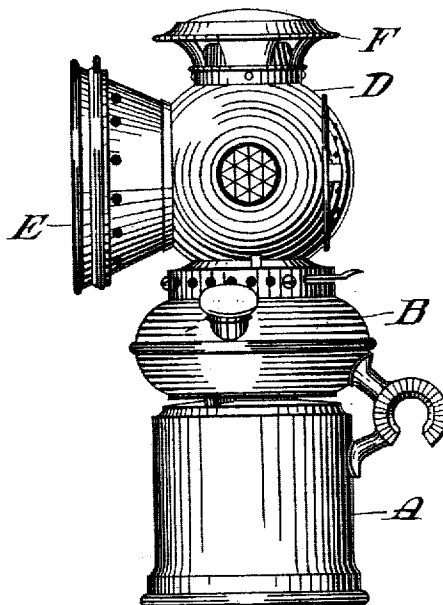
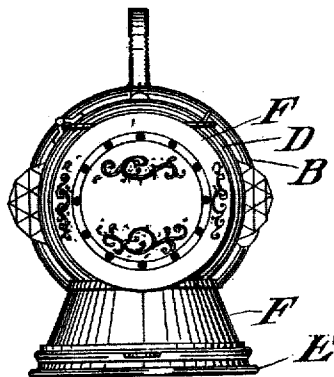

DESIGN FOR A BICYCLE-LAMP.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 31,145, dated July 4, 1899.

Application filed June 9, 1899. Serial No. 719,972. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM C. HOMAN, a citizen of the United States, residing at Meriden, county of New Haven, State of Connecticut, have invented and produced a certain new and original Design for a Bicycle-Lamp, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description.

My invention relates to a new and original design for a bicycle-lamp.

In the accompanying drawings, Figure 1 is a front elevation of a bicycle-lamp, showing the leading features thereof. Fig. 2 is a side elevation. Fig. 3 is a plan view.

The leading features of my design are best shown in Fig. 1, in which A is a barrel-like base surmounted by an intermediate portion B of a rounded form, in turn surmounted by a body D, in general of a spherical outline, on the side of which is a flared projection E and on the top of which is a hood F.

What I claim is—

The design for a bicycle-lamp substantially as herein shown and described.
