To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Washington L. Gilroy, of the City of Philadelphia in the State of Pennsylvania, have invented or produced a new and original

Design for Paint vessels; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description of the same, reference being had to the annexed drawing, and to the letters of reference marked thereon.

The object of this design is, the production of a sheet metal vessel, suitable for the purpose of 'putting up' white lead and other paints ground in oil, which will serve as a "trade mark".

It consists of a sheet metal case, of a cylindrical form, ornamented with certain plain surfaces and mouldings around its periphery, as hereinafter described.

In the drawing A. A'. A' represent the plain surfaces, and B. B' & B'. B' the mouldings.

The plain surfaces consist of the central part (A) and the two end parts (A'. A'). The mouldings B. B. consist of a series of four modern cyma reversa or o. c. mouldings, arranged around the periphery of the vessel, on each side of the plain face or surface A, as shown in the drawing. The fillets c. c. of these mouldings (B) are each on a straight longitudinal line with the plain surfaces (A. A'. A'), and the convex parts project therefrom a uniform distance, as seen in the drawing.

The mouldings B'. B' consist of the edges of the end disks of the vessel, bent over so as to produce lap seams, of the form shown in the drawing at these parts, which project around from the periphery of the vessel, so as to be on a straight longitudinal line with the convex parts of the mouldings B. B. as seen in the drawing.

What I claim herein as my invention or production is a vessel of the cylindrical form described, whose periphery is ornamented with the plain surfaces (A. A'. A'), Mouldings (B. B.) and Mouldings (B'. B.) arranged in relation to each other and the vessel, as set forth, as a new and original Design for a Paint vessel.
