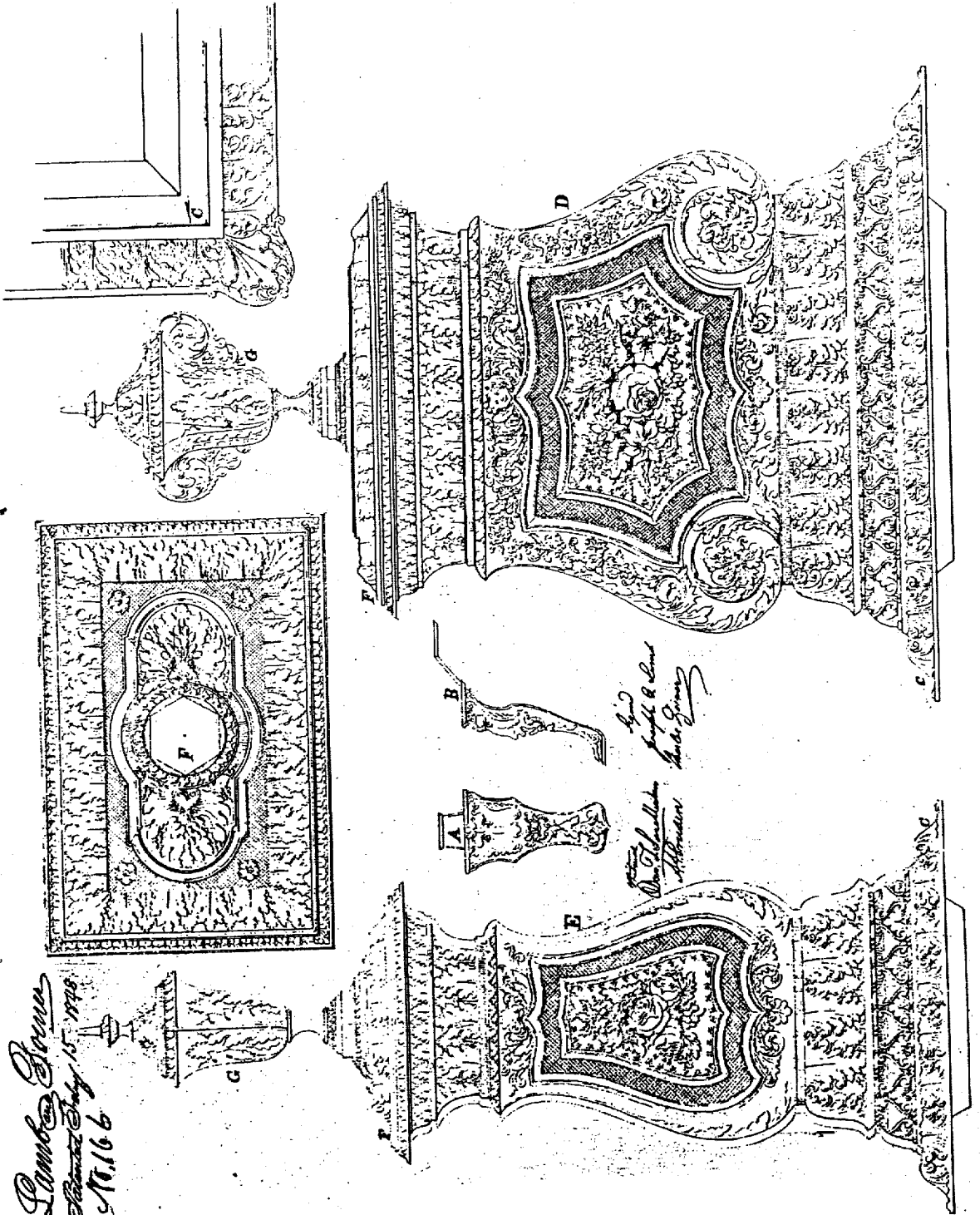

Joseph G. Lamb, & Charles Joiner, Cincinnati, Ohio,
Letters Patent N^o 166, dated 15th February 1848.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and marking
part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, Joseph G. Lamb and Charles Joiner,
both of Cincinnati, County of Hamilton, State of Ohio, have invented -
and produced a new ornamental design for coal and air-tight
parlor stoves, and we do hereby declare that the following is a

full and exact description of the same. The foot has for a prominent ornament an imaginary caricature crumpled and, represented in drawings marked A and B. - The bottom or hearth plate, is surrounded by an ornamented ovolo moulding with projecting-corner ornaments, see drawings C. - The front back and end plates, have an outline form as follows, an ornamented quarter round base, above it a flattened and ornamented ogee moulding, above that a lyre shaped portion, surmounted by an ornamented cove frieze and ogee cornice, with a single sunk panel, with a raised centre, containing a bouquet of flowers in the center of the lyre shaped portion, see drawings D and E. - The top has a raised circular center piece, forming a stand for a vase on each side, length ways, a cluster of leaves and buds, in the center of a sunk panel of check work, surrounded by an ornamented ovolo moulding, the whole surrounded by a small ornamented border, see drawings marked F. - The whole surmounted by a hexagon base of the style and design represented in figures G. - For a more perfect description you are referred to the accompanying sample stove. We claim the privilege of placing the door in front, or either end, also of cutting away a portion of the lower parts of the front, back, and end plates, or either of them, for ^{the} coal stove, and inserting therein a grate and fire plates or bricks or other material.

Having thus fully described & represented the different parts of our stove, - we wish it understood that we do not claim the outline shape or configuration of the body of our stove, aside from the manner of paneling and ornamenting the same, being aware that substantially the same shape has been in use from time immemorial, for chair backs, Table pillars, Newel Posts, Pallusters &c. &c. But what we do claim as new and our invention, and desire to secure by letters patent of the United States is, the particular shape and configuration of the stove with the

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ornamental designs thereon as represented and described, as a whole.

We -- claim also, the manner of ornamenting the front, back, and end plates, particularly the Baskets of Flowers as shown in the center panels, also the Rosettes and accompanying figures as shown on the stiles, or pilasters, also the configuration of, and manner of ornamenting the Foot, the bottom or hearth plate, The top, and the vase, or urn, as described and shown in the above specifications and accompanying drawings.
