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
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(54) Title: METHOD AND APPARATUS FOR VASCULAR ACCESS



(57) Abstract: A vascular access device comprises a bridge having first and second bores therethrough, a dilator in the first bore, and a needle guide in the second bore. The second bore is at an angle with respect to the first bore such that the needle guide is at the angle with respect to the dilator. The device is useful, for example to achieve dual site entrance to a blood vessel.
