
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
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(54) Title: METHOD AND SYSTEM FOR CENTRALLY ORGANIZING TRANSACTIONAL INFORMATION IN A NETWORK ENVIRONMENT



(57) Abstract: A computer-aided transaction processing method and system for documenting transactions conducted in a network environment. The system includes a first database (500) for storing a user identifier and identity information for at least two users. An information processing system (400) manages a transaction between the at least two users, wherein a transaction identifier is associated with the transaction. A second database (600) stores a database record. The database record contains the transaction identifier, user identifiers of the at least two users involved in the transaction, and corresponding transactional data.
