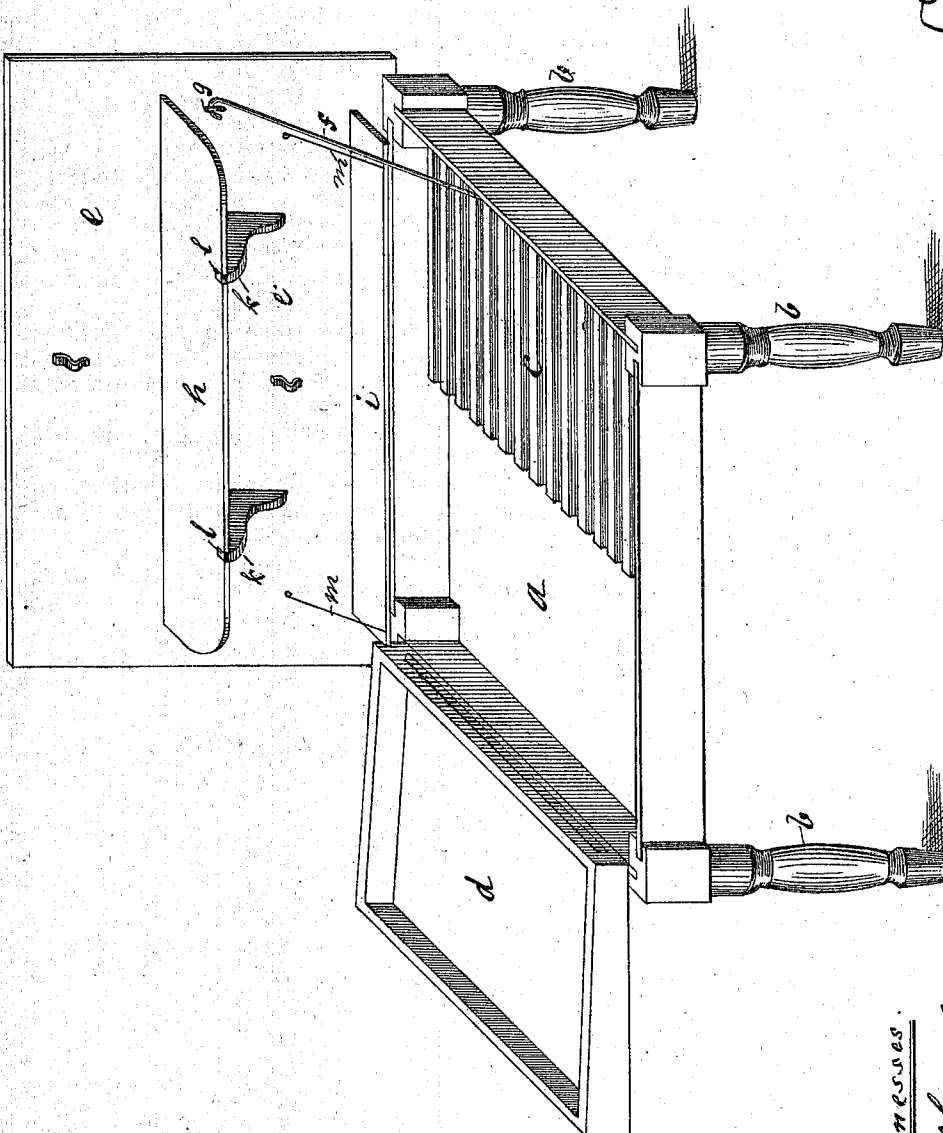

IMPROVEMENT IN TABLE-SINKS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 115,408, dated May 30, 1871.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN WYLIE, of Bethel, county of Fairfield and State of Connecticut, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Combined Table and Sink; and to enable others skilled in the art to make and use the same, I will proceed to describe, referring to the drawing, in which the same letters indicate like parts.

Nature.

The nature of my invention consists in combining sink, table, drainer, rack, shelves, and other convenient appendages in one piece of furniture.

Description.

In the accompanying drawing, *a* is a box-sink, supported by legs *b*. Inside of this sink is provided a movable drip-rack, *c*; and at one end of this sink is provided a drainer-receptacle, *d*, which is hinged to the edge of the sink, so that when not in use it will close down into the body of the sink, and when open for use is held in an inclined position by a fly-bracket hinged to the sink. *e* is a table-bed, hinged to one side of the sink, and when open for use the cover is held in an elevated position by stay-rods and staples *f g*. Upon this

table-cover are arranged shelves *h i*. The shelf *h* is hinged to the cover and supported in readiness for use by fly-brackets *k*, they being provided with dowels *l* which enter openings in the shelf to hold the brackets in their proper place while in use. The other shelf *i* is also hinged to the bed, and is supported in place when in use by rods or cords *m*.

When this sink is not wanted for use the drainer *d* is turned down into the body of the sink; the shelves *h i*, with their brackets, are closed and held against the under side of the cover by suitable fastenings or buttons, and the cover closed down over the sink, when it will be ready for use in a table form.

I believe I have thus shown the nature and construction of this invention so as to enable others skilled in the art to make the same therefrom.

What I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The combination of a sink, *a*, with a hinged cover, *e*, drainer *d*, rack *c*, and bracket-shelves *h i*, substantially as set forth.
